Khole in History** have a major role in curriculum design. Other faculty members make important suggestions regarding curriculum in workshops organised on revised syllabi.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

- Annual Teaching Plan is prepared by respective teachers in accordance with the academic calendar of the college.
- Modern amenities for effective teaching are provided to each department.
- Feedback on teaching is sought annually from the random number of students.

- Recap regarding the completion of syllabus is sought by the principal in the term end meetings.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

- The college also conducts Home Assignment and Test in each semester for the students of Arts and Commerce faculty. Unit Test and Group Discussion are organised occasionally.

There is a research committee in the college. Faculty members holding doctoral degrees are its members. As per the guidelines of IQAC, the principal of the college and the research committee encourage the faculty members and students not only to participate in National and International Conferences but also to prepare proposals for Minor Research Projects of UGC. Two faculty members have awarded Ph.D. degree in the academic year 2017-18.

Shri S.I Barale (Department of Economics) was awarded Ph.D. degree of Shivaji University, Kolhapur in January 2018. **Shri. Mulla I. H.** (Physical Director) was awarded Ph.D. degree of Savitribai Phule Pune University, in May 2018. Three of faculty members namely **Dr. S. M .Sathe** (English) **Dr.S. C. Khole** (History) and **Dr. S.J. Kirdat** (Hindi) are working on minor research projects in their respective disciplines.
